Program Goal

The goal of the
Migrant Education Program is to ensure
that all migrant students reach
challenging academic standards and
graduate with a high school diploma
or a GED that prepares them
for responsible citizenship, further
learning, and productive employment.



Who is eligible?
A child between the ages of 3-21 years, that moved on their own, with parents or guardians within 36 months across school district lines.

To work temporary or seasonal in the following:

- *Farming (plowing, planting, cultivating, harvesting, and processing of farm crops)
- *Dairy Work (feeding, milking, and rounding up)
- *Poultry or Egg Farm
- *Planting, Growing, or Harvesting of Trees
- *Pinestraw Bailing
- *Commercial Fishing (fish/saltwater, crabbing, shrimping, and clamming)
- *Nursery Work (planting, potting, and pruning)

What Does The Program Offer?

Educational & Social Services

A variety of services are available to migrant students in addition to the educational services provided by Suwannee County School District.

Educational Services:

- Facilitate enrollment in existing preschool programs
- Provide in-home Pre-K instruction
- Provide instructional support for students (Grades K-12)
- Assist with parent-teacher conferences
- Monitor students' progress
- Provide summer school services
- Assist with enrolling children in school or other education programs
- Conduct parent workshops/training
- Provide assistance with MSIX (Migrant Student Information Exchange)

Social Services:

- Assist with interpreting/translation services
- Provide hygiene bags and educational packets for OSY (Out of School Youth)
- Provide health supportive assistance in cooperation with other agencies
- Assist with school supplies
- Provide advocacy and outreach services
- Provide transportation
