The Suwannee County School District provides professional development for teachers, paraprofessionals, and leaders through collaboration with discretionary projects and area educational consortia. The district ensures teachers, paraprofessionals, and leaders have access to regular, on-going, job-embedded professional learning provided by content area district coordinators, district leaders, and school-based academic coaches. The collaborative nature of the professional learning planning allows for comprehensive and succinct opportunities to delve into Florida's challenging academic standards in a variety of settings, including Professional Learning Communities, face-to-face sessions, and virtual learning sessions (synchronous and asynchronous). These rigorous experiences ensure teachers, paraprofessionals, and leaders are prepared to meet the demands of the academic standards. Suwannee County School District contracts with several vendors to provide professional development designed to improve implementation of programs and products designed to improve learning outcomes for all students.

The Suwannee County School District provides professional development for teachers, paraprofessionals, and leaders through collaboration with discretionary projects and area consortia. The district ensures teachers, paraprofessionals, and leaders have ample opportunities to improve their craft through a vairety of professional learning experiences. The district provides support for new teachers through a vear-long induction and mentoring program lead by district coordinators. For teachers seeking certification through an alternative pathway, the district offers the Professional Development Certification Program. Teachers collaborate and engage in professional development through a variety of Professional Learning Communities that may focus on grade level, content area, or other focus area. On a monthly basis, the executive leadership team organizes training for all district and school leaders to further develop the leadership dispositions related to the district strategic plan.

- 1. New Teacher Induction (Year 1 of PDCP): The district provides monthly training for new teachers. The trainings focus on FEAPS, district policies and procedures, and instructional practices. The trainings occur outside of the workday to accommodate a variety of schedules. Costs associated with stipends will be incurred. 15 teachers x 18 hours @ \$100 per hour = \$2700.

 Handbook: Demonstrating the Florida Educator Accomplished Practices by L. Cross (\$50 x 15 = \$750). Supplies for participants: Binders, dividers, colored paper, post-its, etc. \$200
- 2. Teacher Leader Cadre: In an effort to improve educational outcomes for at-risk students, the district will establish a Teacher Leader Cadre. - 3. Study Guides for Teacher Certification Exams: Study guides and resources will be purchased to support teachers in becoming certified during the 2021-22 school year. Study guides and materials will be available to teachers to check out and will be purchased based on the district's out of field list and the new teacher induction group needs. \$500
- 4. NEFEC Clinical Education training: Clinical education training is provided as a service to the district as a NEFEC member, however participants must attend one day of face-to-face training per module. The district is in need of additional mentors to support the new teachers in induction and Professional Development Certification Program. Costs associated with travel (maximum of 80 miles roundtrip x 50.445 x 3 = \$106.08) and substitutes (\$135 per substitute x 3 =405.00) for one day to allow classroom coverage for up to 12 participants.
- 5. District Clinical Educator Program: District coordinators are certified to deliver the updated clinical educator training. Two days of face-to-face training will occur in July. Additional follow up will occur during the school year through Canvas, the district learning management system. Stipends for 2 six-hour days at stipend rate of \$10 per hour x 20 participants= \$2400
- 6. Reimbursement for endorsements and certification exams: Reading and Gifted endorsements are needed for teachers to remain infield and effective on an ongoing basis. Teachers will be reimbursed the cost of registration for endorsement courses upon proof of completion and valid payment (10 courses x 5300 = 53000). Teachers who utilize the K-12 Reading exam as a pathway to endorsement will be reimbursed the cost of registration for the exam passed upon proof of official passing score report and valid proof of payment (8 x 5150=51200). Total activity: \$4200.
- 7. Language Arts B.E.S.T. Standards training and curriculum development. Teachers will learn more about standards stacking with facilitation from the State Regional Literacy Director and District Coordinator for Reading K-12 to develop lessons for B.E.S.T. booklist selections in conjunction with the newly adopted curriculum materials. \$10 per hour x 8 hours x 50 teachers = \$4000 plus benefits.
