## JOINT STATEMENT:

Suwannee County School District (SCSD) Suwannee County Sheriff's Office (SCSO)

Due to the uptick in information circulating around social media platforms regarding fentanyl-laced paper money being discovered locally, this joint communication serves to inform the public of our knowledge of that information and to provide resources to our public regarding this national crisis.
